#### Personal belonging (10-15)


is the kind of belonging we experience with our families and close friends, where we have mutually disclosed information that is personal and assumes a high level of

#### Public belonging (70+) is the kind of belonging we experience with those whom we may not know personally but with whom we are connected through some external commonality.






#### Ephesians 4:11-16

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



### Tools

#### 7 P's of Incarnational Expansion



#### **PRAYER**

prayer for clarity of calling "to whom am I sent?" and intercessory prayer for the Kingdom to come among those people.



#### **PROXIMITY**

establish life rhythms that keep you routinely rooted among those to whom you are sent.



#### **PARTNERS**

find some disciples who want to join in the calling, or some people of peace "in the field" who want to receive you.



#### **PARTNERS**

relationally leaning into those who are leaning into you with Kingdom intentionality.



#### **POWERLESSNESS**

demonstrate a willingness to receive, to be served, to not have all the answers, building mutual kinship.



#### **PLANT**

plant the good news of Jesus, and Lord willing, plant a community there that proclaims and demonstrates the Kingdom.

#### **PATTERN**

ground the emerging community into the way of Jesus with spiritual formation patterns, a shared rule of life.

From there, new disciples start praying through calling and it all repeats... over and over again.



#### PHILIPPIANS 3 DIAGNOSTIC

7 But whatever were gains to me <u>I now consider loss for the sake of Christ.</u> 8 What is more, <u>I consider everything a loss</u> because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for <u>whose sake I have lost all things</u>. I consider them garbage, that I may gain Christ 9 and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which is through faith in Christ—the righteousness that comes from God on the basis of faith. 10 I want to know Christ—yes, to know the power of his resurrection and <u>participation in his</u> sufferings, becoming like him in his death, 11 and so, somehow, attaining to the resurrection from the dead.




