

PHILIPPIANS 3 DIAGNOSTIC

7 But whatever were gains to me <u>I now consider loss for the sake of Christ.</u> 8 What is more, <u>I consider everything a loss</u> because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for <u>whose sake I have lost all things</u>. I consider them garbage, that I may gain Christ 9 and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which is through faith in Christ—the righteousness that comes from God on the basis of faith. 10 I want to know Christ—yes, to know the power of his resurrection and <u>participation in his</u> sufferings, becoming like him in his death, 11 and so, somehow, attaining to the resurrection from the dead.

- What is your community holding on to or what discomfort is it avoiding which creates a barrier between Jesus and each other?

This isn't always bad as some communities are young but it is important to pay attention to as you seek to mature together.


